Commitment and Remembrance

Lesson Purpose

This lesson explores baptism and the Lord’s Supper as two sacred ordinances given by Jesus to His church. Baptism publicly declares that a believer has accepted Christ, died to the old life, and chosen to walk with Him in newness of life. The Lord’s Supper calls believers to remember Christ’s sacrifice, receive His grace afresh, seek reconciliation, and renew their commitment to follow Him.
